

Grant applications will usually require a narrative section—a statement of purpose that details the project and establishes your timeline. This is where you offer detail on how you will achieve your goals + what types of support you will need

# WHEN PREPARING A GRANT PROPOSAL

- Give specific examples
- Create white space and small paragraphs
- ALWAYS have someone proofread your materials
- Be concise and clear
- Use action verbs
- Create a story that your reviewers can visualize

# **GRANT WRITING** CHECKLIST

- 1. What are the goals of your project?
- 2. What are the goals of the funding organization?
- 3. What stage is the project in?
- 4. How long will it take you to complete the project?

#### **Heading Page:**

This lists your name + title for your proposal. It can also include an image of your work

### **First Paragraph:**

Brief statement of your mission, work, need, what you want to accomplish, and the name of the grant

### **Body Paragraphs:**

Include further details about your work and the activities you hope to accomplish to achieve your outcomes.
